

The GDPR is already in effect.

Penalties for noncompliance are up to €20 million (\$23 million) or 4% of annual global turnover.





The GDPR was passed by the European Union (EU), but applies to any company worldwide that targets EU users.

### What is it?

The GDPR is a ground-breaking privacy law that regulates how companies collect, handle, and protect personal data.

Personal data is worth trillions of dollars - in the digital age, it's like oil. Strict legislation ensures companies process it responsibly.

### Does my business need to comply with the GDPR?

## What is personal data?

Personal data is any information shared online that can be used to identify an individual.
